What's the Buzz with Electrostatic Disinfectant Spraying?


COVID-19 has brought cleaning to the forefront and leaving many to wonder what is the best way to not just clean, but disinfect surfaces that might harbor germ and viral matter.

A seemingly new technology has made headlines around the globe and you may have heard your cleaning company tout it's effectiveness in the fight against COVID-19. This method of spray disinfecting is *electrostatic spraying*. This method is really not new at all, and actually has been around for years. You might not of hear about it as the equipment is very costly and until recently, very few cleaning companies and their clients would pay the price to utilize this effective disinfecting technique.

Electrostatic is based on the principle that "opposite charges" attract and "like charges" repel. Two positively charged things will repel each other. Using this natural electrostatic phenomenon, various manufacturers have developed tools to be used in the cleaning industry. The way it works is water is mixed with disinfectant and is sprayed out with a positive electric charge. That electric charge makes the mixture act like a magnet to any negative or neutral surface that is sprayed. Because of that, the disinfecting spray gets in every nook and cranny and stays there to kill the virus or bacteria. The spray tip used with the spraying unit determines the droplet size of the product based on the EPA listed dwell time. The disinfecting product dissipates/dries and leaves most all surfaces spotless and disinfected.

Electrostatic disinfectant spraying is listed under the CDC's cleaning and disinfecting guidelines. It's important to note the CDC recommends a detail clean to remove all gross debris, followed by the spray.
